The Houze Family

Our interest in the Houze family derives from the marriage of Margaret J. Houze and Henry Covell in 1885. Margaret was the daughter of the blacksmith at Lombardy, Henry Houze, while Henry Covell was the son of Arthur Covell who owned a wood shingle/cheese box factory close by.

Henry Houze was married twice. Margaret was the last child by his first wife Elizabeth Moodie of North Burgess. Henry's father, Henry Sr., is believed to have also been a blacksmith in the Perth area. It is not known exactly where Henry Sr. was located because none of the Houzes appear in the 1851 census. Elizabeth died some time after Margaret's birth but no details have been found. Henry remarried in 1869 to Isabella Moodie, a cousin of Elizabeth.





"Henry Houze took over the Ireland blacksmith shop which he bought from Joseph Willis in 1868. Unlike the previous blacksmiths, Houze thrived and expanded his enterprise in the village. He came to the village from Perth, already an experienced man in the trade, in his early thirties. During the 1880s Houze exchanged his land for that owned by the Gilday brothers, carriagemakers near Klyne's hotel. Houze also bought another property from Thomas Gilday across the street from the old shop next to O'Reilly's hotel. Houze tore down the old forge that was once run by James Ireland in 1888 and later built a frame house on the site. He had a carriage house and wood shed built on his new property across the street. At this point, Houze operated both a blacksmith and a carriagemaking shop in Lombardy. The former was run by Robert Clark, who later started his own, and the latter by John Munroe, who had worked for Houze for about twenty years from the 1870s.

Like so many people in villages and in the country, Houze was the victim of fire. In 1893, the paint shop of his carriagemaking business was destroyed. Nothing was saved, and he had no insurance on the property. The fire spread to the cheese factory operated by the O'Maras but it was promptly extinguished. Houze made do for a while in an old building before rebuilding the carriage works that year. Houze continued to work until the turn of the century when he turned over his business to his son, George. Henry Houze died in 1904."

The Robert Clark mentioned above would later marry Henry's daughter, Elizabeth.

The Houze family, as far as we have traced to date, comes from Burgess Township, as did the Moodie family to which they are connected.

A fair bit of data has been compiled on the Moodies of North Burgess. This is available in a separate file.

The correct spelling of the family name appears to be with a "z". In earlier records it appears as House but in later records (including grave stones, the "z" seemed to predominate. The Houze family has been victim of many misspellings at census time, as can be seen below.

Census Records

The search continues for the Houze family in the 1851 census. The census indicates that Henry was born in Ontario so his parents should have arrived prior to 1826. No record of the name is found with any of the original Perth Military Settlement records or early Lanark census records (1817-1822). The first census record of Henry is found in 1861.
